Gilles Goncalvez, Teacher



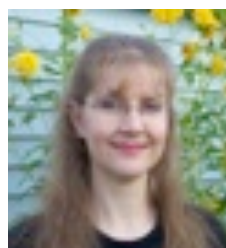

Medicine of the Third Millennium

Becoming a therapist can be an objective for many, but there are in fact numerous ways to professionally increase the value of your training, convictions and passions. In fact, when this education takes an entirely new direction from what was previously chosen, then it becomes possible to integrate acquired skills to new and vast knowledge, based on prevention and health education. Everyone gets to choose his/her own path.

Opportunities: Living Your Passion

Educate and Accompany

Consultation

The therapist can choose to work alone, as an independant worker, or with a group of other therapists of complementary skills. It is also possible to be an employee in a health-oriented organization (rejuvenation centers, for example).

Health and Research

For a number of medical, paramedical and social professionals, the naturopathic approach offers a way of growing their practice with more of a global perspective of the individual, rather than simply a symptom perspective.

Sports club, rejuvenation centers, thalassotherapy centers

Here the therapist offers an often new and complementary service to those offered within the establishment. The emphasis is on prevention and education. Any number of positions can be envisioned, from accompaniment to facilities management.

Transmit and Share

Education, training and animation

The therapist will be either an independant worker, employed by an organization or business and will fulfill an increasing and varied demand for information and training from the public, schools and businesses (restaurants, cooperatives, daycares, retirement homes, etc.). It will involve animation: anything from occasional to regular courses, mentoring, organized internships or thematic retreats, etc.

Communication and specialized journalism

Because of the increasing interest in alternative medicine from the public, even general media offers opportunities to the specialist: managing a health, well-being or nutrition column, for example. The same applies to communications--public or private--in as much as the environment and health become at stake.

Promote and Sell

Advertising and marketing

In light of public interest, a number of companies are created, or refocus themselves, to fulfill these new demands. They need knowledgeable contributors or consultants in this new field because the approach largely exceeds that of business.

Events

Seminars, expos, organic fairs, and eco-festivals are growing in numbers and require personnel that is in tune with the spirit of such events.

Sales, store management

Organic boutiques of all kinds, libraries, research labs: this retail sector is growing regularly. These establishments must fulfill the expectations of their clients, not only with specialized marketing, or even offering "products", but especially by providing quality information dependant on a good knowledge of health concerns.

Distance Education: Balancing Quality and Liberty

The Alternative Medicine College of Canada has deliberately made the choice to offer distance education programs to allow everyone, no matter where they reside, to get the education they want. This choice requires certain skills on the part of the student. It also has special requirements at the educational level in order to ensure efficient and productive training.

Fundamental Objectives of our Programs

Our programs aim at satisfying three main founding objectives in alternative medicine.

- **Educate:** Healthy lifestyle and quality of life education for those eager to incorporate healthy living factors into their own lifestyle.
- **Prevent:** Through personal healthy lifestyle programs based on weight control, dietary balance, correcting nutritional deficiencies, detoxification, revitalization, exercise, stress management, etc.
- **Heal:** Therapeutic solutions offered using natural care methods and within the scope of those methods.

Essential Skills to Develop

Distance education is intended for adults. It aims at building certain skills.

- **Autonomy:** Ability to follow the continual evolution of knowledge in the field.
- **Critical thinking:** Analysis of lines of reasoning within the field of alternative medicines.
- **Creativity:** Openness to learning new dimensions by associating new elements.
- **Adaptability:** Handling changing conditions by partaking in the transformation of society and the renewal of social values.
- **Communication:** Capacity to make knowledge accessible to others.

Advantages of Distance Education

Distance education allows you to study where you want, thanks to appropriate didactic materials and the help of a tutor. They will smooth the way to knowledge, without regards to distance, by helping you manage your time and giving you greater autonomy. This methodology is adopted more and more by private schools and university students all over the world.

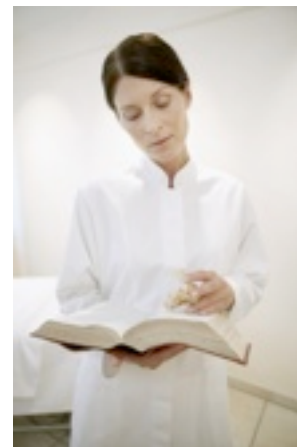

Doctorate-Specific Objectives

Elevating One's Practice

In addition to clinical case studies—veritable hands-on exams—the curriculum constitutes practical and concrete coaching. The Client-Practitioner Relationship course allows the practitioner to identify specific profiles and is essentially given the educational components involved which must take into account affinities, personalities, needs, and capacity for personal investment of each individual. The Developing a Professional Practice course focuses on legal considerations, office management, and includes aspects of marketing and how to generate income.

Internship, which must be completed under the supervision of an active practitioner, completes the curriculum.

Pursuing a Topic of Interest

The Doctorate program allows an in-depth investigation of a topic of predilection, which can even become a professional orientation. The thesis paper offers the student the opportunity to reflect, conceptualize and apply. It is as much a theoretical as a practical exercise allowing individual expression.

First-Level Doctorate Programs

In addition to the Naturopathy, Homeopathy or Bioenergetics program, the first-level Doctorate curriculum develops clinical expertise. This program is also available for active practitioners wanting a first-level doctorate. To register to this distance education program, you must have completed a Naturopathy,

Homeopathy or Bioenergetics certification or have obtained an equivalence from the AMCC.

Equivalence & Exemptions

If you have already taken courses, or modules, in another institution and now wish to obtain a diploma from the Alternative Medicine College of Canada, choose our Equivalence Program. A list of available equivalences is given below.

You may also request a course equivalence (maximum of 3 courses).

Equivalence Request

To request a diploma equivalence, you must have taken all of the courses and obtained an equivalent number of credits (or hours) as the College's required number of credits in the chosen field. The College allows you to take the missing courses, as long as these do not represent more than about 30% of the courses in the chosen program.

For the Equivalence Request, you must fill in the appropriate form, supplied by the College, cover the administration fees, make a first payment and send supporting documentation with your request.

Registration Procedure

Please state the title (and number) of the diploma.

Download the Equivalence Request Form.

Consult the course descriptions by clicking on the program/module of your choice and verify that you actually have an equivalent for each course, and if you are missing any courses.

Go to the Online Registration Form and choose one of the equivalences. Fill in the requested information on both forms (Online Admission Form and Equivalence Request Form). Compose a hand-written letter stating your professional or scholastic journey and your projects or objectives. Gather your documents and mail everything to the address on the form. Contact the College if needed, by phone or email.

Exemptions

You can request and obtain an exam exemption for one or more courses taken in another institution:

- You can receive the course material anyways, but are under no obligation to take the exam.
- Or you do not wish to receive the course materials and can get a reduction in the program's price, equivalent to the price of the exempted courses.

For course exemption requests (three courses maximum), you must fill the Admission Form, send all supporting documents and pay the administrative fees for the exemption request.

Tuition Fees
